

## Call for papers

The **Roumanian Biotechnological Letters** (ISSN 1224-5984) is currently accepting manuscripts for publication. The journal publishes high-quality solicited and unsolicited articles, in English, in all areas of applied biochemistry, industrial microbiology, molecular biology, genomics and proteomics, food and agricultural technologies, and metabolic engineering. All articles published in RBL are peer-reviewed.

Our objective is to inform authors of the decision on their manuscript within three weeks of submission. Following acceptance, a paper will normally be published in the next available issue.

*It is a condition of publication that manuscripts submitted to this journal have not been published and will not be simultaneously submitted or published elsewhere.*

*The contents of the manuscripts concern the authors directly.*

## Types of Paper

**Regular articles (original papers):** These should describe new and carefully confirmed findings, and experimental procedures should be given in sufficient detail for others to verify the work. The length of a full paper should be the minimum required to describe and interpret the work clearly.

**Short Communications:** A Short Communication is suitable for recording the results of complete small investigations or giving details of new models or hypotheses, gene isolation and identification, innovative methods, techniques or apparatus.

**Minireview:** Submissions of mini-reviews and perspectives covering topics of current interest are welcome and encouraged. Mini-reviews are also peer-reviewed.

The criteria for publication are weighted toward quality and significance to the biotechnology field. Articles will be assessed according to their originality, scientific merit, and experimental design; the manuscript will be evaluated for its conciseness, clarity, and presentation.

Authors should prepare their manuscripts according to *our* instructions for authors. Every submission will be reviewed by editors or members of the editorial board.

Submission of a manuscript implies that it represents original work not previously published: that is not being considered elsewhere for publication; it will not be published in all forms and media, without the consent of the Associated Editors or Publisher. It will also be assumed that the authors have obtained all necessary permissions to include in the paper items such as quotation, figures, table, etc. The Publisher and the Associated Editors will not refuse any reasonable request for permission to reproduce any of their contribution to the journal.
